
GREENTENNIS™ NEWSLETTER



Over 400 *million* tennis balls end up in landfills each year, with 125 *million* of them being from the United States alone. 20 *thousand* tonnes of waste are accumulated from tennis balls annually. Over 400 is the number of *years* it takes for a singular tennis ball to biodegrade. These are staggering statistics. But consider one more: 99% of a tennis ball can be recycled, repurposed, and saved from landfills.



With millions of balls produced and discarded annually, the disposal of non-biodegradable tennis balls poses a considerable challenge to environmental preservation. Additionally, the maintenance and construction of tennis courts often require large amounts of energy, water, and chemicals, contributing to resource depletion and pollution. Furthermore, the tennis industry heavily relies on single-use plastics, from packaging materials to water bottles. This leads to excessive plastic waste that ends up in landfills and ecosystems, causing long-term harm to our planet.

The imperative for sustainability in tennis and sport as a whole is evident, and I observed this myself as an avid tennis player. When I started GreenTennis in 2020, I wanted to build a platform where tennis players could come together as a community to help their sport for the better. A place where we contribute to sustainability the smart way, following the idea of "save today, so we can use tomorrow." GreenTennis is a place where an individual can do something locally to help tennis and end up counting globally. Above all, redefining what it means to be a tennis player on the court and a player in society.

Chapters & Ambassadors



CHAPTERS


